Scholarship Season is Here

Two scholarships available for fall 2023 school year

Choptank Electric Trust Scholarship


The Choptank Electric Trust Board is pleased to announce that our annual scholarship program will begin accepting applications on January 2, 2023. The Choptank Electric Trust Scholarship awards nine \$2,000 scholarships every May to high school or home-schooled seniors, graduating juniors, or first-semester graduating seniors whose parent or legal guardian is a current member or employee of Choptank Electric Cooperative. Applicants must enter a post-high school educational institution or technical/trade school as a freshman in the fall of 2023.

Scholarship recipients are selected based on a combination of the following criteria:

- ✓ Financial need
- ✓ Academic achievement
- ✓ Extracurricular and community activities
- ✓ References
- ✓ Personal essay

The required essay should be limited to two typed, double-spaced pages on the following topic: "Why have I chose to continue my education and how will this scholarship assist me?"

Letters of reference are required and may be from school administrators, teachers, civic leaders, clergy or neighbors (not from relatives). Please limit to three references. The Academic Information section of the application must be completed by the student's guidance counselor or



other appropriate school official.

Applications postmarked after March 15 will not be eligible for consideration. For additional information and to download the application, please visit:

The VMDAEC Education Scholarship



Electric cooperatives in Virginia, Maryland and Delaware are preparing to accept scholarship applications for high school seniors who intend to pursue higher education studies. These \$1,000 scholarships are awarded by the Virginia, Maryland & Delaware Association of Electric Cooperatives Education Scholarship Foundation, which has provided nearly 1,000 scholarships to graduating high school students since 2001, totaling more than \$900,000.

“This program has helped hundreds of students advance their education and demonstrates, once again, how electric cooperatives are committed to their members and the communities they serve,” says Brian Mosier, president and CEO of VMDAEC

The application opens on January 30, 2023, with the application deadline on April 3. Award recipients will be notified no later than June 1. The

online application and additional information can be found at vmdaec.com/scholarship.

Any high school or home-schooled senior graduating in spring 2023, and whose primary residence is served by Choptank Electric Cooperative, is eligible to apply for a \$1,000 scholarship toward a two or four-year college or trade school.

An applicant must be entering his or her first semester at a post-secondary or technical/trade school in the fall of 2023. Scholarship funds will be sent directly to the educational institution and must be used toward tuition, student fees, room and board, or textbooks.

The Foundation’s board of directors will select recipients based on these weighted criteria: financial need at 40%, academic achievement at 40%, and personal statement at 20%. Questions about donations and the application process should be directed to: scholarship@vmdaec.com.

Our training facility in Salisbury, Maryland provides lineworker crews with real-life scenarios in a safe and controlled environment. Built on site at our Regional Service Center, Choptank Electric crews and other cooperatives’ crews use our training grounds to practice and hone their skills and to learn new techniques.

Our newest addition to the training yard is our “Smurf Lines.” This innovative construction allows lineworkers to perform tasks at a safer level while still providing real-world situations. By having trainees at a lower height, it allows better verbal communication with instructors and maximizes training sessions.

Choptank Electric Supports *Beacon of Hope*

Harriet Tubman's new statue, *Beacon of Hope*, is a beautiful dedication to a woman who dedicated her life to, and became a world-wide symbol of, human rights, strength and freedom. Created by artist Wesley Wofford and erected just miles from where Harriet Tubman was born, the monument's official dedication was this past September. Choptank Electric Cooperative is extremely proud to take part in, and help support, what turned into a community-wide effort in immortalizing Harriet Tubman. This effort is important so that future generations know and understand the strong role and responsibility she took in our rich American History.

Escaping slavery in 1849, Harriet Tubman spent the next decade helping other slaves escape. She then worked for the Union Army during the Civil War and would be the first woman to lead an armed expedition, liberating more than 700 slaves during that time.

Her sculpture was installed at the Dorchester County Courthouse in Cambridge, MD. A meaningful location as the courthouse was once the site of slave auctions, as well as the site of the first escape engineered by Harriet Tubman. Members can visit *Beacon of Hope* in person at 206 High Street in Cambridge, MD.

Winter Storms

Winter is here and with last year bringing a steady flow of freezing temperatures, snow and ice, we ask members to always be prepared for winter weather and subsequent outages. This includes having an emergency kit ready.

equipment. Touching energized wires can cause serious injury or death. If you see downed wires, call 911 immediately.

When using a generator, **NEVER** run it inside your home or garage. They produce carbon monoxide fumes, which can be deadly.



RED CROSS EMERGENCY KIT ESSENTIALS

- Water—1 gallon per person, per day
- Food—non-perishable, easy to prepare
- First-aid kit and flashlights
- Medications (7-day supply) and medical items
- Battery-powered or hand-crank radio
- Extra batteries and multipurpose tool
- Sanitation and personal hygiene items
- Cellphone with charger
- Family and emergency contacts
- Coolers and ice to preserve food
- Safe alternative heat source

Lineworkers have a dizzying array of gear they carry and wear to safely do their jobs. Some items, like climbing hooks and hot sticks, have been around since the early days of electricity. Others, like wireless headsets and arc-rated clothing, are more modern innovations. Here's a comprehensive (though not exhaustive) look at the tools line crews use to stay safe.



- Rail boards with bucket lips
- Tool holders and backpacks

2023 Maryland General Assembly Underway

The Maryland General Assembly begins the 444th Legislative Session on the second Wednesday in January. The recent General Election yielded a new Governor, almost a dozen new Senators and almost 30 new Delegates. Governor Wes Moore will officially be sworn into office on the third Wednesday – January 18, 2023. From that point on, the leadership of the General Assembly will follow his lead on key issues such as budget, education, energy, healthcare and transportation.

During the 90-day session, 188 elected officials will consider almost 3,000 bills. We can expect a lot of briefings and “get to know the issues” meetings in Committees over the first month. Leadership is expected to rebalance committee assignments to assure adequate representation of regions on each major committee.

Going into the session, revenues in Maryland are higher than anticipated. This will give appropriators extra cash to divvy up among priorities, such as education

reform, social programs and, hopefully, broadband construction.

Voters also passed the constitutional amendment to allow the use of recreational marijuana in the state. The General Assembly will craft the rules for growing, distributing and selling the product during this session.

As a member-owned electric cooperative, Choptank will educate legislators about unique grid upgrades needed in rural areas to accommodate new standards for electric vehicles and other green

energy initiatives. We will monitor all bills introduced to identify those that may have an impact on the services we provide to cooperative members. Our goal continues to be affordable and reliable energy and broadband options for members.

We will work closely with the Eastern Shore Delegation. These 16 legislators, who serve on various committees, caucus every Friday morning during session to protect the interests of the Eastern Shore. You can monitor bills that are introduced and watch Committee hearings on the MGA website at:




